



**Notice to PCSUD Customers  
May 2016  
Stage 0 - No Water Shortage Conditions**

In an effort to better prepare for potential drought conditions and to promote ongoing conservation of local water resources, The City of Mineral Wells has amended its Water Conservation and Drought Contingency Plan to add a Stage 0. The goal is to achieve a voluntary 10% in reduction in total water use. Due to contracts, the District must implement the Water Conservation and Drought Contingency Plan of the City of Mineral Wells and the Brazos River Authority; the District's two sources of water. On April 21, 2016 the PCSUD Board of Directors amended the District's Water Conservation and Drought Contingency Plan to add a Stage 0.

Beginning June 1, 2016 and going forward, the District will implement a twice a week schedule for unattended landscape watering (irrigation systems, lawn sprinklers, etc.) Unattended landscape watering will not be permitted between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. Hand watering of landscaping and gardens will be permitted on any day of the week subject to the time of day restrictions noted above. All other water use, such as washing cars, filling swimming pools, etc. will be permitted on any day of the week and will not be subject to the time of day use restrictions.

Even numbered Physical addresses (0, 2, 4, 6, 8) may water Monday & Thursday.  
Odd numbered Physical addresses (1, 3, 5, 7, 9) may water Tuesday & Friday.
